SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 10TH 2011 10.A.M. - 6.P.M.

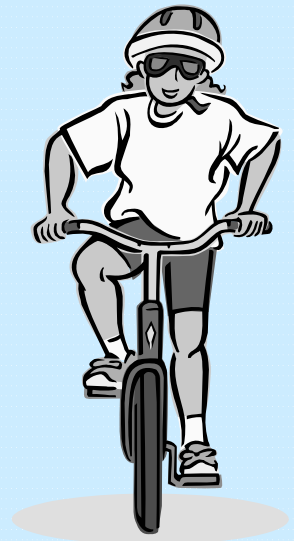
**Ride and Stride for Historic Churches
