and an opportunity to try them on.*

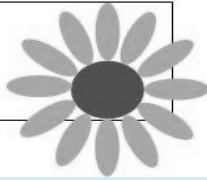

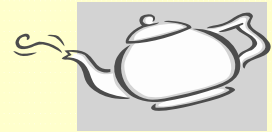
**Bunny Wood Open Day
